Memo from Public Works Director and Citizen's Advisory Solid Waste Recycling

William Tarman-Ramcheck, Public Works Analyst, presented a resolution on electronics recycling and requested authorization to forward to Common Council and State legislators. Mr. Tarman-Ramcheck stated that electronic equipment recycling was previously done by WI Department of Corrections Badger State Industries (BSI) at no-cost. BSI will now charge \$5.00 per monitor at computer recycling events. Mr. Tarman-Ramcheck stated that advances in computer and television technology will cause electronics recycling needs to continue to grow.

Ald. Sullivan verified that there will be no additional cost to residents. Mr. Tarman-Ramcheck stated that there are no additional costs at the present time, but there could be in the future. He also stated that efforts are being made to find a vendor that could provide the services at less than \$5.00 per monitor.

Moved by Ald. Sullivan, seconded by Ald. Grimm to recommend approval.

Ald. Birschel asked if computers are being put into landfills. Mr. Tarman-Ramcheck confirmed that residential computers are put into landfills. Ald. Krill stated that it is difficult to reuse hard drives because sensitive information is retrievable.
