Property Tax Statements

The 2010 property tax statements are expected to be mailed in early December. The preferred method of payment is to mail your tax payment in the green envelope provided with your tax bill. Mail the entire tax bill and your check made payable to the City of Wauwatosa.

Don't forget to endorse the escrow check. The tax bill will be receipted and promptly returned to you.

For those who pay their property taxes using the three-installment plan, the first installment must be paid in full no later than January 31, 2011. The second installment is due March 31 and the third, May 31. Failure to make the full installment payment by each due date will result in the remaining balance being subject to interest and penalty charges.

Payments can also be placed in the 24-hour depository located on the southwest end of city hall near the employee entrance.

The treasurer's office is open Monday – Friday 8 AM – 5 PM. The office is closed on Friday, December 24 but is open Friday, December 31 from 9 AM – Noon.

To find your property tax bill on line visit www.wauwatosa.net. Click the Property Search box on the left side of the page. You will be taken to the Property Search page where you can access property information by address or parcel number. After entering the property information and clicking 'Search', the Property Information page is displayed. Tax information is near the bottom of the page where you can reprint the tax bill. When making a payment, the reprinted tax bill is an acceptable alternative to the original bill.

Snow Emergency Parking

During a snow emergency there is no parking on any street in Wauwatosa, except for the loading and unloading of passengers (3 minute maximum) or loading or unloading of property (30 minute maximum), provided parking restrictions are not already in place at the location.

Winter Water Preparation

Here are some tips to prepare plumbing for the winter season:

- Turn off your outside hose bib from inside.
- Locate the water meter and make sure the area is heated.
- Make sure water meter shutoff valves operate properly so you can turn off your water in an emergency.
- Fit exposed water pipes with insulation sleeves or wrapping.
- Open the cabinet doors under sinks to allow warm air to circulate around the water pipes.
- Leave a small stream of cold water flowing through a faucet during extremely cold weather.

Fire Hydrant Access

The Wauwatosa Water Utility and the fire department routinely check city fire hydrants during winter preparation. Fire hydrant visibility and accessibility are crucial during the winter. You can help by shoveling snow away from fire hydrants to make them accessible in case of fire emergency.

Christmas Tree Collection

Real Christmas trees clear of wrappings, wire, metal, nails, or tree stands and placed at the curb will be picked up between Jan. 10—14 on regular pickup day and chipped into mulch. Do not put a tree in the alley. Put artificial trees or wreaths in the regular garbage.

- For medical waste (syringes, sharps, & other items), use a pharmacy or hospital disposal program, see www.dnr.state.wi.us.

Snow and Ice Removal

The full width of public sidewalks, crosswalks, and curb ramps must be cleared of snow and ice to the plowed portion of the street by 12:00 noon of the day following a snow or ice accumulation. Sprinkle irremovable ice with a de-icing agent or sand to prevent slippery conditions. Sidewalks and ramps are to be cleared again after each plowing operation. Sidewalks on major streets are inspected for compliance and the residential areas are inspected on a complaint basis.

Notice of noncompliance is sent to a property owner if snow and ice is not removed as required. If the work is not completed within the allotted time, city crews will perform the work and charge the property owner. For example, a 60-foot wide lot would be charged \$165.00 each time it is cleared by city crews. Call the Parks and Forestry Department at 471-8420 if you have questions or to report a violation.



We will need the following information to process a claim: address where incident occurred; date of incident; amount of damage claimed; any information such as truck number, witness names, etc. You will be notified after the city determines the claim's validity.

Wauwatosa Distinguished Citizen 2010

Since 1964, the Wauwatosa Distinguished Citizen Award Council has annually recognized qualified individuals who have made significant voluntary contributions to the community life of Wauwatosa.

Nominations are currently being accepted for the WAUWATOSA 2010 CITIZEN OF THE YEAR.

Nominations may be made by any person, group of persons, or organization, but self-nomination will not be accepted. It is not necessary for a Nominee to be a resident of Wauwatosa, but volunteer service in and to Wauwatosa and its residents is mandatory.

Due to a tight budget, the City may, among other expenditure restraint strategies, not be printing paper copies of the newsletter in 2011. Winter Reminders

Please keep the following in mind this winter:

- Clear a curb or driveway area for your refuse and recycling carts. Do not place the carts on the sidewalk or on top of a snow drift.
- Backyard refuse pickup residents need to clear a path that is at least 3 ½ feet wide from the storage area to the street.
- Keep carts accessible but clear from roadways or alleys so plows do not hit or bury them during heavy snowfalls.

American Transmission Co. gathers feedback on proposed power line to cross Wauwatosa

American Transmission Co. hosted a public open house at the Wauwatosa Civic Center Oct. 21 to allow area landowners and members of the public to comment on ATC's proposal for a new 138,000-volt transmission line to be located primarily in Wauwatosa.

ATC is proposing to build the approximately 2-mile transmission line to connect to a new substation We Energies plans to build adjacent to the existing Milwaukee County Substation and Milwaukee County Power Plant at 93rd Street and Watertown Plank Road.

Medical Wastes

Syringes, sharps & other items - Use pharmacy or hospital disposal programs - see www.dnr.state.wi.us

Cooking oil Take to HHW site noted above; or freeze in small containers & insulate them before placing in garbage.

Pet wastes, cooled ashes, sawdust, foam peanuts & other loose items should be wrapped or bagged before placing in curb or Drop-off Center garbage. **Paint** should be hardened to put in trash—or recycled as HHW

Curbside leaf collection begins in October

The annual leaf pickup program will begin on Monday October 17, 2010. Residents may rake them into the curb **STARTING Saturday, October 15th through Sunday, November 13th**. Go to www.wauwatosa.net for specific areas of pick-up. **DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO THE CURB AFTER SUNDAY 11/13/11. Violators are subject to a charge for removal of leaves placed out after the final pickup has been completed.**



YARD MATERIALS

Every-Other-Week Curb Yard Material Pick-up

April 18h to October 14th: leaves and brush must be separated from other household garbage, and are collected **every other week** at curbside, **on the opposite week as recycling**, according to the "A" & "B" schedules on previous page. Do NOT include grass clippings, root balls, vegetables, stumps or branches over six inches in diameter. Please remember to:

- 1) Place at the curb (or alley) before 7:00 a.m.
- 2) Mark reusable containers "YARD MATERIAL" (or "yard waste") in letters 2" or bigger, or use paper yard bags (**NOT plastic bags**)
- 3) Bundle brush with string/twine (**NOT wire or plastic rope**), and **NOT more than 4 feet long and 50 lbs.**
- 4) Call 414-471-8422 for pick up of **LARGE piles** of un-bundled brush/branches (see "Specials" on back page).

Grass Clippings

Grass is not collected at the curb or Drop-off Center. Handle grass clippings by:

- 1) **composting;**
- 2) **grass-cycling;**
- 3) **mulching;**
- 4) using **commercial services** to manage your lawn & clippings.
REMINDER: USE ONLY PHOSPHORUS FREE FERTILIZERS
i.e. 24-0-12

DROP-OFF CENTER – IN PUBLIC WORKS YARD

Open Tues - Sat 7:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

With a Valid \$20.00 Annual or \$5 Daily Permit - Drop-off is for RESIDENTS:

Recyclables - newspapers, catalogs, magazines, office/school papers, books, files, cardboard, paper bags AND metal cans, glass bottles & jars, **AND all plastic bottles and tubs marked #1 through #7**

Motor oil - used motor oil from vehicles (**NOT** hydraulic fluids, solvents, paints, or vegetable oil)

Scrap metal - metal pans, chairs, siding, shelves, pipes, doors, fences, **EMPTY** paint cans, **PUNCTURED** gas cans, and other scrap metal (**NOT** batteries, ballasts, propane tanks, microwaves, TVs, hazardous wastes, etc.).

Clean fill - clean dirt, sod, rocks, rubble, bricks and concrete block

Wood - clean/unpainted/untreated lumber/pallets/crates

Yard materials—brush, branches, leaves (**NOT** grass clippings, plastic bags, rocks, railroad ties, or landscape timbers).

Garbage - household rubbish (**NOT** household hazardous wastes—see previous page for HHW)

E-WASTE RECYCLING

WHAT IS E-WASTE?

- computers;
- desktop printers and printer/fax/copier/scanner combinations; and
- video display devices, including televisions, laptop computers and computer monitors with displays of at least 7" in the longest diagonal direction
- computer peripherals, including keyboards, mice, hard drives and other devices;
- fax machines; and
- DVD players, VCRs and other video players (i.e., DVRs).

Major appliances—\$25.00 each for: air conditioners, heat pumps, dehumidifiers, dishwashers, microwave ovens, dryers, refrigerators, fluorescent light fixtures, stoves & ranges, freezers, washers, furnaces, water heaters

Tires - \$5.00 per pass. tire \$10.00 per tire over 16"

Small business refuse - \$55/ton by permit (\$25) – must be weighed in/out on PW truck scale Tues thru Fri and pay via credit card

With a Valid Permit These Items are Given Away FREE to Wauwatosa RESIDENTS:

Wood chips – made from City trees collected at the curb - chipped either at the curb in portable wood chippers or in the Public Works Yard in the stationary chipper.

Composted leaf mulch (when available) - made from leaves composted last year - use as a soil additive & mix with dirt for best results.

Fire wood - available "as is" from other residents who have dropped it off

SPECIALS

Special Curb Collections Requiring a FEE

Call 414-471-8422 for a pick-up; but fees may be assessed without advance scheduling. Invoices go to residents or property owners. Fees are reduced for appliances & eliminated for brush & garbage if taken to Drop-off (see back page)

- **Brush/branches:** 55.00 minimum charge
- **Extra Garbage:** \$50.00 for up to 15 bags/ boxes, or \$65.00 for over 15 bags/boxes
- **Furniture:** \$50.00 for 1 item; \$5.00 each added item
- **Mattress &/or Box Spring:** \$55.00 per set
- **Uncut Carpet:** \$65.00 minimum charge
- **Concrete:** \$65.00/cu.yd. minimum charge
- **Construction Debris/Lumber:** \$65.00 min. charge

A LITTLE BIT ABOUT HOW WE GOT HERE...

1937-1939 – THE HOYT PARK POOL IS BUILT WITH FEDERAL DOLLARS, REPLACING THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY SAND-BOTTOM SWIMMING HOLE AT HOYT PARK, AND CONTINUING A WATER RECREATION LEGACY THAT SPANS 100 YEARS AT THE SITE.

2003 – MILWAUKEE COUNTY CLOSES THE POOL AT HOYT PARK: 65-YEAR-OLD FAILING POOL IS TOO EXPENSIVE TO REPAIR.

2006 – FRIENDS OF HOYT PARK & POOL FORMS AS A 501(C)(3) NON-PROFIT TO RAISE MONEY TO BUILD AND OPERATE A NEW STATE-OF-THE-ART POOL, BRINGING OUTDOOR SWIMMING BACK TO THE HEART OF OUR COMMUNITY.

2007 – FOHPP NEGOTIATES A 55-YEAR LEASE WITH MILWAUKEE COUNTY FOR GOVERNANCE OF THE FACILITY.

2009 – THANKS TO THE GENEROSITY OF THE TOSA FOUNDATION, LOCAL FOUNDATIONS, MAJOR GIFT DONORS, AND COMMUNITY SUPPORTERS, FOHPP RAISES ENOUGH MONEY TO BUILD A NEW POOL AT HOYT PARK AND RENOVATE THE HISTORIC BATH HOUSE. MILWAUKEE COUNTY COMMITS \$1.5 MILLION FOR HOYT PARK IMPROVEMENTS.

SUMMER 2010 – THE OLD POOL IS DEMOLISHED AND CONSTRUCTION IS UNDERWAY ON THE NEW POOL. CONSTRUCTION WILL BE COMPLETE BY MAY 2011.

TODAY - FOHPP STILL NEEDS TO RAISE \$325,000 TO PAY FOR THE AMENITIES AT THE NEW TOSA POOL AT HOYT PARK. THESE AMENITIES INCLUDE THE WATER SLIDE, DECK CHAIRS, GIANT SHADE UMBRELLAS, TABLES AND CHAIRS FOR THE CONCESSION AREA, DIVING BOARDS AND STARTING BLOCKS.
