Mr. Kesner as Chair called the meeting to order at 1:34 p.m.

Request by Super Western/Michels to operate portable concrete crushing equipment on Mayfair Road as part of a DOT project

Mr. Porter stated that the city received a request last week for this equipment from the contractor. Per City Ordinances, a special permit for mining equipment is needed in order for this to be allowed. The equipment will facilitate the removal operation and recycle the old concrete as sub base material for the new pavement in the area of Mayfair Road between Research Drive and Wisconsin Avenue. A similar request was made by Vinton Construction Company in 2011 as part of the Blue Mound Road reconstruction project.

Mr. Pulvermacher provided pictures of the equipment that will be used showing little or no dust clouds. The noise of the equipment is minimal. A water truck follows the equipment to minimize the dust. They will be operating during normal business hours and do not anticipate nighttime or weekend work. The pavement will be crushed and reused as they move along.

Mr. Burns commented that the DOT requires that the contractor provide a dust plan and this has been completed. The process will also be monitored by the DOT. The existing sewer inlets will have fabric and baskets in them for control to keep the dust and debris from going into the system.

Mr. Wehrley stated that the City has already received complaints of noise and is requesting that the contractor be conscious of this while in residential areas and to keep the equipment mobile and moving.

Mr. Mainus asked if the contractor was aware of the hours for the noise ordinance. Mr. Trapp stated he was aware of the noise ordinance and anticipates operating only during the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Mr. Trapp would like to begin the project on April 15th and anticipates it will take approximately three weeks.

Moved by Ms. Ledesma, seconded by Ms. Enders to approve the request by Super Western/Michels to operate portable concrete crushing equipment on Mayfair Road as part of a DOT project for a three week period with an anticipated start date of April 15 (weather permitting), anticipated hours of operation

will be between 7:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and to maintain movement of the equipment.
