- Flooring
- Home furnishings
- Light fixtures
- Lumber & wood
- Mantels, beams and other architectural elements

Reach out as soon as possible, to coordinate work with your project schedule.

2 Ask your contractor or waste hauler to take your remaining debris to a licensed construction and demolition recycling facility.
