


Wauwatosa Cemetery Chapel

2435 Wauwatosa Avenue

The Wauwatosa Cemetery Chapel was constructed on the site of the current public library in 1852 in a simple brick Greek Revival-style for use as the First Baptist Church. In 1888, Frederick Underwood purchased the building, removed the bell tower, and converted it into an armory for the Wisconsin Light Guard. When the Guard disbanded in 1914, he moved the building to its current site and donated it for use as a chapel. Soon thereafter, the building's exterior was modified to its present appearance. The Chapel is recognized for its contribution to Wauwatosa's religious and cultural history.
