Budget Overview

PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Approved level for sworn full time is 104 or 2.0 officers per 1,000 of the City's population. Currently we are operating with 98 officers however, 2 are on Light Duty, 6 are in Field Training, 5 are in the Police Academy, and 4 are on parental leave.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update January 2023

<u>Homicide</u>— There were 0 homicide. There was 1 reported overdose this month, 0 overdose was fatal; 1 overdose was likely related to heroin/opiate.

Shootings— There were 3 shootings reported this month. 3 firearms were taken as evidence this month.

23-000001: At approx. 00:37 on 1/1/2023, officers responded to the 6000 blk of W Meinecke for a call of shots fired. When officers responded, they recovered four rifle casing.

23-000022: At approx. 10:40 on 1/1/2023, officers responded to the 6600 blk of W Center St. for a call of shots fired in to a vehicle. Six shell casing were recovered with one round lodged in the front dashboard. One individual was arrested in this incident.

23-001204: At approx. 22:1 on 1/14/2023, officers responded to the 10100 blk of W Vienna Ave. for a call of shots fired. Two shots were reported following a police pursuit.

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There was 1 sexual assault and 1 indecent exposure reported this month.

<u>Robbery</u>— There were 5 robberies reported this month.

23-000623: At approx. 14:35 on 1/8/2023, one person was arrested for a strongarm robbery that occurred in the 6200 Blk W Martha Washington. The suspect approached the victim from behind and forcefully removed the victim's purse.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 16 assaults reported this month. 10 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

Burglary— There were 5 burglaries reported this month.

January saw 3 garage burglaries and 1 business burglary. 1 burglary had an unknown date of occurrence but was reported in January.


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 99 thefts (47 retail thefts and 23 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 12 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 7 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 2 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 17 (+6 attempts and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 14 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 2 vehicles take while they were running. 16 of the 17 vehicles have been recovered.

Arson— There was 0 arsons reported this month.

<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u> — There were 7 OAWIs reported this month (7 Alcohol related and 0 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 15 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 14actual vehicle pursuits.
