Budget Overview

The budget numbers will not be available until the 2022 budget is closed out, approximately March or April.

PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Approved level for sworn full time is 104 or 2.0 officers per 1,000 of the City's population. Currently we are operating with 98 officers however, 4 are on Light Duty, 5 are in Field Training, 5 are in the Police Academy, and 3 are on parental leave.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update February 2023

<u>Homicide</u>— There were 0 homicides. There were 0 reported overdoses reported this month, 0 overdoses were fatal; 0 overdoses were likely related to heroin/opiate.

Shootings— There were 2 shootings reported this month. 5 firearms were taken as evidence and 2 were reported stolen this month.

23-003488: At approx. 10:16am on 2/11/2023, an unknown suspect fired 6 shots from a handgun while hanging out of the passenger window in the 6000 block of N 77th St.

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There were 0 sexual assaults and 1 indecent exposure reported this month.

Robbery— There were 3 robberies reported this month.

23-003423: At approx. 5:05pm on 2/10/2023, a MB suspect approached the victim and displayed a handgun in the 6800 blk of W North Ave. The suspect fled the area after taking the victim's shoes.

23-003563: At approx. 2:02am on 2/12/2023, three younger MB exited a Dodge charger in the 8800 blk of West North Ave and demanded money from the victim.

23-003727: At approx. 18:00 on 2/13/2023, a Pick 'N Save (State St.) employee attempted to stop a subject removing items from the store without paying. The subject threatened to shoot the employee. The subject fled the area in a silver 2014 Ford Escape.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 7 assaults reported this month. 3 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

<u>Burglary</u>— There were 5 burglaries reported this month.

February saw 2 business burglaries, 2 residential burglaries and 1 storage unit burglary. 80% of the burglaries were none forced entries.


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 88 thefts (39 retail thefts and 14 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 6 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 7 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 3 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 13 (+4 attempts and +2 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 12 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 12 of the 13 vehicles have been recovered. YTD: 36 (+11 attempts and +2 not returned rentals) motor vehicles have been reported stolen.

Arson— There was 0 arsons reported this month.

<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u> — There were 8 OAWIs reported this month (7 Alcohol related and 1 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 16 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 9 actual vehicle pursuits.

Mayfair Mall:

A Year-to-Date comparative analysis of Mayfair Mall shows a decrease in calls for 2023. In 2022, calls totaled 216 compared to 184 calls in 2023. A comparison of 2018 with 2023 shows a decrease of - 29.50%. A comparison of 2013 with 2023 shows a decrease of - 37.84%.

The Mayfair Collection: Opened for Business in 2014

A Year-to-Date comparative analysis of The Mayfair Collection shows an increase in calls for 2023. In 2022, calls totaled 35 compared to 40 calls in 2023. A comparison of 2018 with 2023 shows a decrease of – 23.08%. *There is no comparison of 2013 with 2022 as the collection opened in 2014.*
