## Police Department Monthly Status Report

### Budget Overview

The budget numbers will not be available until the 2022 budget is closed out, approximately March or April.

### PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Approved level for sworn full time is 104 or 2.0 officers per 1,000 of the City's population. Currently we are operating with 98 officers however, 4 are on Light Duty, 5 are in Field Training, 5 are in the Police Academy, and 2 are on parental leave.

### OPERATIONS Major Crime Update **March 2023**

**Homicide**— There were 0 homicides. There was 1 reported overdose reported this month, 0 overdoses were fatal; 1 overdose was likely related to heroin/opiate.

**Shootings**— There was 1 shooting reported this month. 5 firearms were taken as evidence and 2 were reported stolen this month.

**23-005478:** At approx. 4:48 on 3/7/2023, officers responded to the 4100 N 92 St for a call of shots fired. When officers arrived, they located one subject who was struck by gunfire.

**Sexual Assaults**— There was 1 sexual assault and 3 indecent exposures reported this month.

**Robbery**— There were 3 robberies reported this month.

**23-005147:** At approx. 6:15 on 3/3/2023, an unknown BM attempted to grab the victim's jacket while pointing a knife at the victim. The subject let go of the jacket when the victim began to scream.

**23-006419:** At approx. 13:30 on 3/16/2023, a FB was arrested for robbery at 2500 N Mayfair Rd (Macy's). The subject was attempting to remove items from the store without paying for the items, when an employee attempted to stop the subject. The subject then threatened to "mace" the employee.

**23-007383:** At approx. 8:55 on 3/27/2023, a domestic dispute occurred at the Epiphany Learning Center and Daycare. A known subject then stole an employee's cell phone.

**Assaults**— There were 12 assaults reported this month. 3 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

**Burglary**— There were 13 burglaries reported this month.

March saw 4 burglaries reported at an office building in the 1400 blk of Underwood Ave. 63.64% of the burglaries reported occurred at non-residential areas.

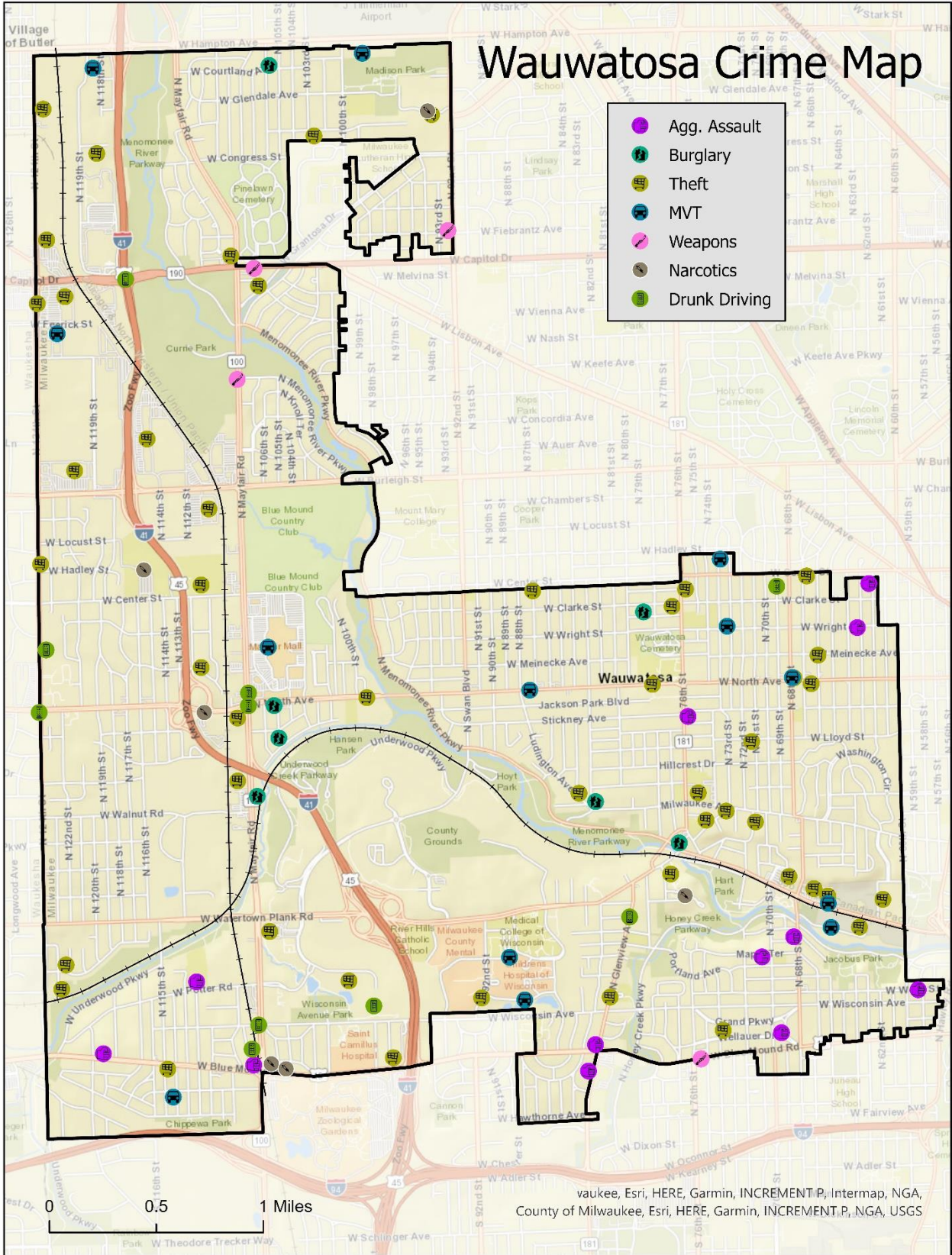
**Thefts**— There were 119 thefts (63 retail thefts and 21 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 20 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 13 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 9 reported at Home Depot.

**Theft of Motor Vehicles**— There were 12 (+1 attempt and +0 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 10 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 9 of the 12 vehicles have been recovered. YTD: 42 (+11 attempts and +4 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

**Arson**— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

**Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)** — There were 10 OAWIs reported this month (9 Alcohol related and 1 Drug related)

**Pursuits/Eluding Cases** – There were 16 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 10 actual vehicle pursuits.



## CITATION & ARREST STATISTICS

174 arrest citations were issued in March

437 traffic citations were issued in March

**Beginning with the April 2022 Monthly Report, a 10-year Comparative Analysis column has been completed for the below tables, referencing the total number of “calls” in the categories listed.**

### Mayfair Mall:

A Year-to-Date comparative analysis of Mayfair Mall shows a decrease in calls for 2023. In 2022, calls totaled 318 compared to 286 calls in 2023. A comparison of 2018 with 2023 shows a decrease of - 33.18%. A comparison of 2013 with 2023 shows a decrease of - 35.87%.

### The Mayfair Collection: Opened for Business in 2014

A Year-to-Date comparative analysis of The Mayfair Collection shows an increase in calls for 2023. In 2022, calls totaled 50 compared to 70 calls in 2023. A comparison of 2018 with 2023 shows a decrease of – 18.60%. *There is no comparison of 2013 with 2022 as the collection opened in 2014.*
