# PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Approved level for sworn full time is 104 or 2.0 officers per 1,000 of the City's population. Currently we are operating with 96 officers however, 2 are on Light Duty, 2 are in Field Training, 5 are in the Police Academy, and 1 is on parental leave.

### OPERATIONS Major Crime Update April 2023

<u>**Homicide**</u> There were 0 homicides. There were 2 reported overdoses reported this month, 0 were fatal; 1 overdose was likely related to heroin/opiate.

**Shootings**— There were 2 shootings reported this month. 13 firearms were taken as evidence (21 total) and 1 was reported stolen this month.

**23-008149:** At approx. 10:31 on 4/4/2023, officers responded to the 4500 blk of 92<sup>nd</sup> St for a report of subjects looking into vehicles. Security attempted to make contact with the subject but the subjects fled. Security reported one of the subjects pointed and fired a handgun in his direction. No injuries were reported.

**23-010150:** At approx. 20:43 on 4/23/2023, officers responded to the 7300 blk of Milwaukee Ave for a report of shots fired. One subject was arrested for 1<sup>st</sup> degree recklessly endangering safety and CCW.

**Sexual Assaults**— There were 6 sexual assaults and 1 indecent exposure reported this month.

**<u>Robbery</u>**— There were 2 robberies reported this month.

**23-008041:** At approx. 11:38 on 4/3/2023, officers responded to 6950 W State St (Pick N Save) for a robbery report. One subject was arrested for the robbery of the victim's cell phone.

**23-008282:** At approx. 18:05 on 4/5/2023, officers responded to the 4600 blk of Delco Ave for a robbery report. The victim reported that a cell phone was taken.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 12 assaults reported this month. 5 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

**<u>Burglary</u>**— There were 6 burglaries reported this month.

This month saw 4 residential burglaries (+1 garage & +1 business). 50% were non-forced entries. There was no other discernable pattern this month.


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 93 thefts (62 retail thefts and 10 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 12 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 3 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 5 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 16 (+5 attempts and +2 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 4 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 3 of the 6 vehicles have been recovered. YTD: 50 (+16 attempts and +5 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson — There was 0 arsons reported this month.

**<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u>** — There were 10 OAWIs reported this month (10 Alcohol related and 0 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 32 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 21 actual vehicle pursuits.
