PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Authorized strength will increase from 104 to 109 beginning June 1, 2023 for sworn full time. Currently we are operating with 98 officers however, 1 is on Light Duty, 1 is on medical leave, and we have a total of 7 in Field Training.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update May 2023

<u>Homicide</u>— There were 0 homicides. There were 4 reported overdoses reported this month, 0 overdoses were fatal; 1 overdose was likely related to heroin/opiate.

<u>Shootings</u>— There was 1 shooting reported this month. 13 firearms were taken as evidence (18 total).

23-012953: Officers responded to the 6200 blk of W North Ave on 5/23/2023 for a report of shots fired. Upon arrival the victim told officers that an unknown person fired a single shot at his vehicle.

Sexual Assaults — There were 7 sexual assaults and 0 indecent exposure reported this month.

<u>Robbery</u>— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

23-012676: At approx. 5:33am on 5/20/2023, an unknown MB entered the Clark Gas Station (3106 N Mayfair Rd) and forced the victim to drive to a near-by ATM. The victim attempted to withdraw money from the ATM, when the suspect fired 2-3-gun shots at the victim. The suspect fled the area in the victim's vehicle.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 17 assaults reported this month. 8 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

<u>Burglary</u>— There were 3 burglaries reported this month.

This month saw 0 residential burglaries (+1 storage unit & +2 business).


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 131 thefts (67 retail thefts and 23 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 16 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 18 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 8 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 9 (+2 attempts and +1 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 5 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 8 of the 9 vehicles have been recovered. YTD: 60 (+23 attempts and +5 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson — There were 0 arsons reported this month.

<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u> — There were 7 OAWIs reported this month (7 Alcohol related and 0 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 14 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 8 actual vehicle pursuits.
