PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Authorized strength increased from 104 to 109 beginning June 1, 2023 for sworn full time. Currently we are operating with 96 officers however, 1 is on Light Duty, 2 began the Academy in June, and we have a total of 7 in Field Training.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update June 2023

Homicide— There were 0 homicide and 1 incident initially reported as a homicide (Aggravated Assault). There were 3 reported overdoses reported this month, 0 were fatal; 2 overdoses were likely related to heroin/opiate.

<u>Shootings</u>— There were 2 shootings reported this month. 13 firearms were taken as evidence (18 total).

23-015860: On 6/20/2023 at 02:11, officers responded to the 10300 blk of W Courtland Ave. for a report of shots fired.

23-016441: On 6/25/2023 at 16:52, officers responded to the 10800 blk of W Congress St. for a report of shots fired and people yelling.

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There were 3 sexual assaults and 2 indecent exposures reported this month.

<u>Robbery</u>— There were 3 robberies reported this month.

23-014329: On 6/5/2023 at 10:35, officers responded to 6817 W North Ave for a robbery report. The victim reported that she was robbed at gunpoint two months ago.

23-014760: On 6/9/2023 at 9:58, officers responded to 2656 Wauwatosa Ave for a report of a robbery. A BM entered the Walgreens, jumped on the pharmacy counter, and demanded various medications.

23-016948: On 6/29/2023 at 21:37, officers responded to 2656 Wauwatosa Ave for a report of a robbery. A BM entered the Walgreens, jumped on the pharmacy counter, and demanded various medications (specifically Oxycodone).

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 13 assaults reported this month. 5 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

<u>Burglary</u>— There were 6 burglaries reported this month.

This month saw 3 office burglaries (+1 storage unit & +2 residential/garage).


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 143 thefts (79 retail thefts and 38 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 14 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 6 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 13 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 17 (+5 attempts and +2 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 11 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles take while they were running. 14 of the 17 vehicles have been recovered. YTD: 80 (+34 attempts and +8 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

<u>Arson</u>— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 7 OAWIs reported this month (6 Alcohol related and 1 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 16 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 11 actual vehicle pursuits.
