PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Authorized strength increased from 104 to 109 beginning June 1, 2023 for sworn full time. Currently we are operating with 99 officers however, 1 is on Military Leave, 1 is on Medical Leave, 1 is on Light Duty, 1 is on Paid Administrative leave and we have a total of 7 in Field Training.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update July 2023

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There was 1 overdose reported this month, 0 were fatal; 1 overdose was likely related to heroin/opiate.

<u>Shootings</u>— There was 1 shooting reported this month. 9 firearms were taken as evidence (17 total).

23-017965: On 7/9/2023 at 21:01, officers responded to the 7900 blk of W North Ave for reports of shots fired. Officers found and recovered four spent casings in the intersection.

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There were 0 sexual assaults and 2 indecent exposures reported this month.

<u>Robbery</u>— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

23-018565: On 7/16/2023 at 13:22, officers responded to Home Depot (4100 N 124th St) for a subject threatening to shoot an employee. The subject was attempting to leave the store without paying for various items. When an employee attempted to stop the subject, she threatened to shoot the employee.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 14 assaults reported this month. 8 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

<u>Burglary</u>— There were 9 burglaries reported this month.

This month had 2 burglaries reported at 1300 Glenview Ave (on-going issue with juveniles attempting to enter building).


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 123 thefts (63 retail thefts and 27 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 11 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 6 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 9 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 14 (+12 attempts and +3 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 8 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 13 of the 14 vehicles have been recovered. YTD: 91 (+38 attempts and +11 not returned rentals) motor vehicles were reported stolen.

Arson — There was 0 arsons reported this month.

<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u> — There were 12 OAWIs reported this month (11 Alcohol related and 1 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 18 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 15 actual vehicle pursuits.
