PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Authorized strength increased from 104 to 109 beginning June 1, 2023 for sworn full time. Two officers were sworn in on August 21, 2023 and currently we are operating with 100 officers. We have 5 in the Police Academy, 1 is on Military Leave, 2 are on Medical Leave, 1 is on Light Duty, 1 is on Paid Administrative leave and we have a total of 4 in Field Training.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update August 2023

Homicide— There were 0 homicides reported. There was 1 reported overdose this month, 0 overdoses were fatal; 1 overdose was likely related to cocaine.

<u>Shootings</u>— There were 0 shootings reported this month. 14 firearms were taken as evidence (23 total).

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There were 4 sexual assaults and 3 indecent exposure/Sex Offenses reported this month.

<u>Robbery</u>— There were 5 robberies reported this month.

23-020811: At approx. 4:45 on 8/7/23, the victim observed two BM in his vehicle while it was parked in a driveway in the 2400 blk N 61 St. When the victim confronted the two subjects, one of the subjects yelled "Shoot him! Just shoot him!" The two subjects then fled the area

23-021499: At approx. 19:40 on 8/13/23, a juvenile was arrested for an armed carjacking in the 7500 blk of W Center St. the victim stated she was sitting in her vehicle when she was approached by the subject who demanded the victim's keys and vehicle.

23-022322: At approx. 19:59 on 8/21/23, Target LP reported a subject stole merchandise from the store. When LP confronted the subject, the subject pushed the employee when fleeing the area.

23-022400: At approx. 14:46 on 8/22/23, Discovery Clothing reported a subject stole merchandise from the store. When employees confronted the subject, the subject pushed the employee when fleeing the area.

23-022759: At approx. 11:55 on 8/26/23, Home Depot reported a subject stole merchandise from the store. When LP confronted the subject, the subject threatened the employee with a hammer when fleeing the area.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 8 assaults reported this month. 5 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

<u>Burglary</u>— There were 8 burglaries reported this month.

This month all the burglaries were reported as unforced entries with 62.5% reported as occurring during the nighttime hours.

<u>Thefts</u>— There were 113 thefts (66 retail thefts and 12 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 6 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There was 1 theft reported at the Mayfair Collections and 7 reported at Home Depot.


<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 9 (+7 attempts and +3 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 6 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 6 of the 9 vehicles have been recovered. YTD: 99 (+43 attempts and +15 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

<u>Arson</u>— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 6 OAWIs reported this month (3 Alcohol related and 3 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 13 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate

of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 5 actual vehicle pursuits.
