PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Authorized sworn strength increased by one position for the Froedtert Emergency Department contract on October 1, 2023. Authorized strength increased from 109 to 110 for sworn full time. Currently we are operating with 98 officers. We have 5 in the Police Academy, 1 is on Military Leave, 1 is on Medical Leave, 2 are on Light Duty, and 2 are in Field Training.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update September 2023

September 2023

<u>Homicide</u>— There were 0 homicides reported. There was 1 reported overdose this month, 0 overdoses were fatal; 1 overdose was likely related to cocaine.

<u>Shootings</u>— There were 2 shootings reported this month. 14 firearms were taken as evidence (23 total).

23-023850: At approx. 18:02 on 9/6/2023, a BM was arrested in the 4600 blk N 100th St for Endangering Safety by use of a Dangerous Weapon. This incident was related to a road rage incident.

23-026429: At approx. 21:02 on 9/29/2023, a BF was shot by an unknown subject inside of Meijer. The female was standing in an aisle when she was shot.

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There was 1 sexual assault and 1 indecent exposure/Sex Offense reported this month.

<u>Robbery</u>— There were 5 robberies reported this month.

23-024177: At approx. 21:50 on 9/9/2023, officers were dispatched to Dave and Busters for a report of a subject with a firearm. Upon arrival, officers arrested a juvenile who claimed he was attempting to make a YouTube video by doing a fake robbery.

23-024994: At approx. 15:45 on 9/16/2023, officers responded to the 3000 blk of N 114th St. for a report of a robbery. The robbery stemmed from an argument over payment for movers.

23-026365: At approx. 11:56 on 9/29/2023, a Male Hispanic was arrested at Barnes and Noble after attempting to steal vinyl records. The subject pushed an employee into the shelves before fleeing the store.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 11 assaults reported this month. 8 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related.

Burglary— There were 12 burglaries reported this month.

This month there were 66.67% forced entry burglaries reported. 58.33% of the burglaries were non-residential structures (mostly to garages)


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 100 thefts (51 retail thefts and 16 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 7 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 4 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 6 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 4 (+3 attempts and +4 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 2 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 4 of the 4 vehicles have been recovered. There were no specific vehicle makes stolen. YTD: 102 (+46 attempts and +17 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

<u>Arson</u>— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u> — There were 8 OAWIs reported this month (8 Alcohol related and 0 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 22 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 17 actual vehicle pursuits
