PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Authorized sworn strength increased by one position for the Froedtert Emergency Department contract on October 1, 2023. Authorized strength increased from 109 to 110 for sworn full time. Currently we are operating with 98 officers. We have 3 in the Police Academy, 1 is on Military Leave, 4 are on Light Duty, and 4 are in Field Training.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update

November 2023

<u>Homicide</u>— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 0 reported overdoses reported this month, 0 overdoses were fatal; 0 overdoses were likely related to cocaine.

Shootings— There were 0 shootings reported this month. 8 firearms were taken as evidence (9 total).

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There was 1 sexual assault and 1 indecent exposure/Sex Offense reported this month.

Robbery— There were 2 robberies reported this month.

23-030065: At approx. 12:42 on 11/5/2023, officers were dispatched to Mayfair Mall for a report of a strong-arm robbery. The victim reported that she was leaving the mall when she noticed she was being followed by the suspect. The suspect attempted to grab the victim's sunglasses and a struggle ensued. The victim was able to scare the suspect off by pointing her firearm at the suspect.

23-030241: At approx. 13:00 on 11/7/2023, officers were dispatched to 1717 N Mayfair Rd for a report of a strong-arm robbery. Employees reported that the suspect attempted to take merchandise without paying. When they confronted the subject, she reached to her waist band, implying a weapon.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 10 assaults reported this month. 6 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence related and 1 assault to Police Officer.

<u>Burglary</u>— There were 5 burglaries reported this month.

This month there were 66.67% forced entry burglaries reported. 50% of the burglaries were non-residential structures (mostly to businesses)


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 115 thefts (76 retail thefts and 6 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 25 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 9 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 9 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 2 (+3 attempts and +2 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 2 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There was 1 vehicle taken while it was running. 2 of the 2 vehicles have been recovered. There were no specific vehicle makes stolen. YTD: 112 (+57 attempts and +21 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There was 0 arsons reported this month.

<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u> — There were 9 OAWIs reported this month (9 Alcohol related and 0 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 8 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 4 actual vehicle pursuits.
