Budget Overview

PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 98 officers, 1 is on Military Leave, 4 are on Light Duty, and 4 are in Field Training. Three officers were sworn in on January 3, 2024 and are attending the Police Academy until May, 2024.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update January 2024

<u>Homicide</u>— There were 0 homicides reported. There was 1 overdose reported this month, 0 overdoses were fatal.

Shootings— There were 2 shootings reported this month. 8 firearms were taken as evidence (11 total firearms were placed into property).

24-000339: The suspect approached the victim and asked for a cigarette. When the victim stated that he did not have a cigarette, the suspect shot the victim in the leg. The suspect was later arrested.

Sexual Assaults— There was 1 sexual assault and 1 Sex Offense reported this month.

Robbery— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

24-001504: At approx. 21:30 on 1/17/24, officers were dispatched to 6119 W North Ave for a report of an arm robbery at Number 1 Chinese Restaurant. A BM entered the restaurant, pointed a firearm, and demanded money. The subject was arrested and connected to multiple other robberies in the area.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 13 assaults reported this month. 5 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

Burglary— There were 7 burglaries reported this month.

This month 100% of burglaries that were reported occurred at night. 80% of the burglaries were non-residential structures.


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 94 thefts (58 retail thefts and 6 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 14 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 4 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 7 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 4 (+3 attempts and +2 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 4 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 3 of the 4 vehicles have been recovered. There were no specific vehicle makes stolen. 2024 YTD: 8 (+6 attempts and +3 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u> — There were 11 OAWIs reported this month (11 Alcohol related and 0 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 9 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 3 actual vehicle pursuits.
