Currently we are operating with 98 officers, 1 is on Military Leave, 2 are on Light Duty, and 9 are in Field Training.

# OPERATIONS Major Crime Update February 2024

<u>Homicide</u>— There were 0 homicides reported. There was 1 overdose reported this month, 0 were fatal.

**Shootings**— There was 1 shooting reported this month. 11 firearms were taken as evidence (15 total firearms were placed into property).

**24-003077**: Froedtert walk-in victim. Shooting originated in Milwaukee

**Sexual Assaults**— There were 2 sexual assaults and 0 sex offenses reported this month.

**Robbery**— There were 3 robberies reported this month.

**24-003363:** At approx. 16:57 on 2/6/2024, two MB approached the victim in the parking lot of 10702 W Burleigh St. and demanded the victim's property at gun point.

**24-003615:** At approx. 23:28 on 2/8/2024, a Doordash delivery driver was delivering food, when he noticed a MB entering his vehicle. When the victim noticed this, he attempted to jump into the vehicle's driver-side door. This caused the suspect to crash the vehicle into a tree. The suspect was arrested later that night in Brookfield.

**24-005705:** At approx. 14:16 on 2/29/2024, a MA stolen various items from PetCo. When an employee approached the suspect, the suspect threatened to stab the employee.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 12 assaults reported this month. 4 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

**<u>Burglary</u>**— There were 4 burglaries reported this month.

This month there were 0 residential burglaries reported.


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 114 thefts (74 retail thefts and 11 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 22 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 7 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 12 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 12 (+7 attempts and +1 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 7 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 2 vehicles taken while they were running. 10 of the 12 vehicles have been recovered. There were no specific vehicle makes stolen. 2024 YTD: 16 (+11 attempts and +5 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

**Arson**— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

<u>Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI)</u> — There were 7 OAWIs reported this month (7 Alcohol related and 0 Drug related)

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 7 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed. Officers then make the decision not to chase or initiate a pursuit. Our Officers were involved in 6 actual vehicle pursuits.

### **Mayfair Mall:**
