PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 99 officers, 1 is on Military Leave, 2 are on Light Duty, and 9 are in Field Training. Sgt. Brian Skornia retired on March 1, 2024, after 28 years of service to the City of Wauwatosa. New probationary officers were sworn in on March 1, 2024; Travis Karweik and Dylan Johnson.

OPERATIONS Major Crime Update March 2024

<u>Homicide</u>— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 0 reported overdoses this month, 0 were fatal.

<u>Shootings</u>— There was 1 shooting reported this month. 11 firearms were taken as evidence (15 total firearms were placed into property).

24-006913: Report of 7-8 shots fired from the parking lot. Investigation turned over to MCSO.

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There were 4 sexual assaults and 1 Sex Offense reported this month.

<u>Robbery</u>— There was 1 robbery reported this month.

24-005757: At approx. 7:56am on 3/1/24, an MB was arrested for Disorderly Conduct with a Dangerous Weapon and retail theft. The suspect entered the Clark gas station and displayed a boxcutter while concealing items.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 19 assaults reported this month. 10 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence. 1 incident resulted in an injury to an officer.

Burglary— There were 5 burglaries reported this month.

This month there was 1 residential burglary reported. Most burglaries were to businesses or construction sites (83%). Tools were the item removed the most often.


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 104 thefts (54 retail thefts and 8 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 17 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 4 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 6 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 6 (+6 attempts and +2 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 6 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 0 vehicles taken while they were running. 6 of the 6 vehicles have been recovered. There were no specific vehicle makes stolen. 2024 YTD: 23 (+18 attempts and +6 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson — There was 1 arson reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 12 OAWIs reported this month.

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 8 reported suspects *eluding* officers. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
