# PERSONNEL ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Currently we are operating with 98 officers. 1 is on Military Leave, 3 in Field Training, 1 on Light Duty. 3 officers were sworn in on July 30<sup>th</sup> and began the Academy on July 31<sup>st</sup>, for a total of 4 in the Police Academy.

# OPERATIONS Major Crime Update July 2024

**<u>Homicide</u>**— There were 0 homicides reported. There were 0 overdoses reported this month, 0 overdoses were fatal.

**Shootings**— There was 1 shooting reported this month. 12 firearms were taken as evidence and 3 reported stolen (19 total firearms were placed into property).

**24-022468:** On July 26, 2024, at approximately 3:00 AM, officers heard multiple gunshots and observed a white 2015 Hyundai Sonata (license plate AAC-8837) fleeing the area. The officers pursued the vehicle and apprehended one suspect.

Upon further investigation, they discovered a victim with a gunshot wound to the abdomen at the Curie Park Gas Station. Initial observations suggest that several suspects approached the victim, demanded his vehicle while brandishing a firearm, and engaged in gunfire. The victim was struck in the abdomen.

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There were 6 sexual assaults and 2 Sex Offense/IE reported this month.

**<u>Robbery</u>**— There were 3 robberies reported this month.

**24-021167:** At approx. 16:58 on 7/12, a family was unloading their vehicle in the 1900 blk of Menomonee River Pkwy, when an unknown subject approached them and entered the running vehicle. The vehicle was taken with 2 children inside. The suspect drove the vehicle to the intersection of Menomonee River Parkway and Hoyt Park Drive when the suspect exited the vehicle. The suspect was last seen running on Hoyt Park Drive. The suspect did not produce or imply that he had a weapon.

**24-021234**: At approx. 13:50 on 7/13, the victim was waiting at the bus stop in the 1300 blk of N 72<sup>nd</sup> St, when she was approached by 2 younger BM. One of the males grabbed her purse. When the victim held on to the purse and refused to let go, the suspect lifted up his shirt to imply a firearm. This led to the victim letting go of her purse. The suspect then fled the area in a dark colored Honda Accord with no plates.

**24-021311:** At approx. 15:00 on 7/14, the victim reported that he was sitting in the Mayfair Mall Food Court when he felt someone grab his sunglasses off his head. The victim attempted to retain his glasses and attempted to chase the suspect. The two engaged in a physical altercation. One suspect was arrested.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 13 assaults reported this month. 2 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

**<u>Burglary</u>**— There were 18 burglaries reported this month.

There were 10 reported burglaries at the Enclave Apartments (1200 blk 62st). Multiple bikes were removed from the storage units. 2 people were arrested for these incidents.


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 108 thefts (69 retail thefts and 13 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 17 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 9 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 4 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 12 (10 attempts and +4 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 9 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 2 vehicles take while they were running. 11 of the 12 vehicles have been recovered. 2024 YTD: 49 (35 attempts and +14 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

<u>Arson</u>— There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 6 OAWIs reported this month

<u>Pursuits/Eluding Cases</u> – There were 11 reported incidents of eluding. Eluding is defined as when suspect(s) in a vehicle fail to stop for an officer and then flee at a high rate of speed.
