


n 1854, Dr. Levi Halsted built a small dwelling at the important intersection of the Menomonee River, the plank road and the tracks of the first railroad in Wisconsin. Known today as the Little Red Store for its century-old red color, it served as the first railroad depot in Wauwatosa and was for many years the town's only store. This modest structure was the site of

a wide variety of enterprises, including a post office, harness shop, lending library, plumbing shop,

and fuel and supply company.
