OPERATIONS Major Crime Update September 2024

<u>Homicide</u>— There were zero homicides reported. There were 2 opiate related overdoses reported this month, 0 overdoses were fatal.

Shootings— There were 0 shootings reported this month.

<u>Sexual Assaults</u>— There were 3 sexual assaults and 3 Sex Offense/IE reported this month.

<u>Robbery</u>— There were 3 robberies reported this month.

24-026800: At approx. 17:37 on 9/2/24, a subject approached the victim as she was walking. The subject pointed a firearm and demanded the bag of chips the victim was carrying.

24-028607: At approx. 14:34 on 9/17/24, a MB was arrested for armed robbery-Threat of force at Forefront Dermatology.

24-029041: At approx. 8:20 on 9/21/24, 3 unknown subjects stole various items from Ace Hardware. When an employee confronted the subjects, one of the subjects pushed the employee.

<u>Assaults</u>— There were 12 assaults reported this month. 6 incidents were reported as possible domestic violence.

<u>Burglary</u>— There were 5 burglaries reported this month.

3 Doctors' offices were burglarized over the weekend.


<u>Thefts</u>— There were 149 thefts (97 retail thefts and 14 entries to autos) reported this month. There were 31 thefts reported at Mayfair Mall. There were 5 thefts reported at the Mayfair Collections and 9 reported at Home Depot.

<u>Theft of Motor Vehicles</u>— There were 6 (2 attempts and +5 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen. 2 vehicles were targeted this month were without keys. There were 2 vehicles taken while they were running. 6 of the 6 vehicles have been recovered. 2024 YTD: 60 (39 attempts and +22 not returned rentals) motor vehicles reported stolen.

Arson — There were 0 arsons reported this month.

Operating Auto While Intoxicated (OAWI) — There were 11 OAWIs reported this month
